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| S has 15 HCP so asks N to describe their hand. N replies 3 C , showing a strong weak 2 in Hs. Both these bids must be alerted. With this information $S$ now bids the game in Hs. | W gives the weakest response to E stating they are not interested in game if E holds a Weak 2 in Hs. E corrects the bid to show a Weak 2 in $S$. |
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| S opens 2D and rebids to show a min. 6 card club suit. $N$ has to decide what to do. There is an 8 card fit in Clubs but would NT be better? N must think about South's HCP. With 19 to 22 N holds the QC. Therefore at best only 8 of his partner's points are in Clubs. With at least 11 HCP elsewhere, 3NT should be possible. | W opens 2D and rebids to show a strong flat hand. E enquires using Puppet Stayman. With no $4 / 5$ card major $W$ bids 3NT. |



With a flat hand and values in all suits plus knowing there can be only a maximum of 5 points out against them, N saves time by going direct to 6NT. You can go via Puppet and RKCB but this gives opportunities for the ops to x to indicate lead preferences on artifical bids. You have the points ... go straight there.

North's intervention may seem a little light but he has good shape and is not vulnerable. East's X smacks strongly of his holding 4 spades. South "barrage bids" by jumping in hearts. This has merit because it soaks up bidding space for the side with points and because the LTT implies a profitable score with nine trumps. Holding good trumps, East's second $X$ is for penalties. Although the contract goes 2 light for -300 , it is a good sacrifice should E/W play in 4S.

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| $S$ does an Aussie Bergen raise in response to ps 1 S opener. 3 H , which must be alerted, shows 3 card spade support and 10 to 12 HCP. N decides with shape that is enough for game. | Here $W$ has 4 card support for $E$ and 11 HCP. A Bergen raise of 3 D tells W the range and good support. With a 7 loser hand E has shape but needs $p$ at the top end to reach game. 3 H is an invitation to game. W has a 7 loser hand and should accept the game invite bidding 4S. Both the 3D and 3H bids must be alerted as artificial. |
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| W makes an immediate raise to game anxious to cut out further interference by the opposition. $N$ bids 4Ss easily at this vulnerability. $E$ is in difficulties doubling with his spade holding. W should X giving $p$ option of penalties or bidding 5 H . In fact 5 H does not make on this hand but 4SX goes 3 light and is a steal for the NS pair bidding according to LTT | W reverses, bidding $C$ first and then bidding beyond his opening suit, beyond 2C by bidding 2D. This promises 16 plus HCP. Once E explains his hand by showing a repeat in Hs W puts E back to the first bid suit in case it is a 6 card suit. NTs in a misfit is rarely a good option as transport between hands becomes problematic. |



N should enquire further about S hand and when $S$ indicates a strong point count with Ds be able to confidently bid the makeable 3NT.
