SPLINTER BIDS BERGEN RAISES COMBINED WITH SPLINTER BIDS

SPLINTER BIDS

An artificial bid.

Show a void or singleton in a suit.

Shown by making a double jump shift response

1H - 4C = void or singleton in clubs (Do not alert – bid is beyond 3NT)

1S - 4D = void or singleton in diamonds (")

 $1C - \frac{3S}{S} = \text{void or singleton in spades (Alert - bid below 3NT)}$

Using splinters for the first time – a splinter on the way to GAME. Use in response to major suit openers only 1H/1S For you to use this splinter, 3 conditions of your hand must apply.

You MUST have:

- 1. 4 card support for p's opening major suit
- 2. 10-13 HCP
- 3. A singleton or void

You are showing your shortage on the way to game.

Try these: P open 1H what do you respond?

How do shortages work?

P opens 1S and then shows you a void in Ds.

Which of these hands would you prefer?

SHORTAGE opposite WEAKNESS is GOOD

SHORTAGE opposite STRENGTH is BAD

P opens 1S and then shows you a void in Ds.

P holds: S KQJ982 H A765 D - C A76 You need all your points working for you.

None wasted in the short suit.

This may take a while to get your head around.

When p uses a splinter- you re-evaluate your hand. A in the short suit now counts for only 2 pts. Other honours in short suit – zero. Add in distribution points

Re-evaluate these after an auction 1S – 4C

Your new magic number in your life is: 26

TOTAL POINTS (HCP AND DISTRIBUTION)

P has promised you 10HCP as a minimum. Add on to 10 your re-evaluated number. If you get to 26 – slam is worth investigating.

Eg.
AQJ86 1S 4D
Q2 ?
KQ2
KJ7

Bid 4S – 13TP (the Ds don't count). You need 3 more for slam.

Eg.
AK4 1H 4C
KQJ643 ?

Bid 4NT, going to slam if p has 2 aces. The hands fit well: you have nothing in p's short suit.

Your 16TP ensures at least 26TP

You open 1H, p responds 4C, what do you bid?

If opponent's come in with an overcall Splinters are OFF

First time you use a splinter, expect to be left in a 3 card fit!!!

BERGEN RAISES - THE SEQUEL!!!

We learned first time about how to show an 8 card fit and a 9 card fit in a major suit.

1H - <mark>3H</mark> 0-6 1H - <mark>3C</mark> 7-10 1H - <mark>3D</mark> 10-12 1H - 2NT 13+

We learned the rebids after a 2NT strong response:

4 of a new suit shows 6/5 shape 3 of agreed suit 17+ pts 3NT = 15/16 pts 4 of agreed suit – minimal opener (12-14)

Working solely from the **2NT** bid

We are now going to show shortages to p.

A new suit bid at the 3 level will now show a splinter bid, either a void or singleton in the suit bid. ALERT!!!

Eg. 1H – <mark>2NT</mark> – <mark>3C</mark>

Hearts is the agreed trump suit

The 3C bid – shortage, void or singletoness.

The 3C bid = shortage, void or singleton

Re-evaluate your hand! 26TP MAGIC NUMBER!!

Eg.

AJ7 1H <mark>2NT</mark> KQ65 <mark>3C</mark> ?

A4 9865

15TP plus p promised 12HCP = 27 Bid 6H (after checking not 2 aces out)

Eg

KQ54 1S <mark>2NT</mark> AKQ6 3H ?

K6 763

11TP plus p's 12 is short of the magic 26 Bid 4S

P opens 1S, you bid 2NT, p rebids 3D what now?

4S 6S 4S 4NT

Eg A7

K987 1H 2NT AK65 3NT ?

A65

Bid 6H. Your 19TP plus p's 15-16 ensure 33TP. No need to dally!!

Eg.

AKJ5 1S 2NT KQ5 4S ?

A65 J87

Pass. Pity, but p is showing a minimum with no shortage and there are not 33TP
